Here's the April edition of our Librex Newsletter, which has the goal of keeping you informed about various Librex best practices and presenting you some of our new features.



### Import Documents From Your Mac

Did you know that Librex can be used on your Mac computers? One of the available functions is the electronic documents manual importation window. Librex has the goal of acting as the unified capture tool for all the content of your organization. By allowing document importation from your Mac workstations, new users may benefit from the solution. Doing so raises the utilization rate of Librex in your organization and insures that all your documents are captured through the same process. This way, Librex is really used as the unique entry point for the capture and management of all your documents.

For now, not all functionalities are available on Mac (including the scanning window that requires a Windows operating system) but the vast majority are. It's possible to complete multiple operations including manual importations, virtual printing, consultation, most of the

administration functions and the operations console functions. Contact us if you would like to get the Librex Mac installer.

## Challenge Us!

When designing and coding Librex, we put a special attention at keeping our code generic. By reaching this goal, we make sure that our customers can always update to the latest version quickly and simply. A Librex update only requires a few clicks and a minutes, which is a major asset to help you maintain the solution.

However, this simplicity doesn't mean that we can't manage complex scenarios that are specific to your requirements. Indeed, we have made sure to insert many exit points in Librex where custom code can be added. If such a script is created, Librex will be executed with your specialized behaviour while staying easy to update and maintain.

Those scripts are very powerful. For example, you could decide to use them to fetch information in an external system or to transfer metadata to that system. You could also generate tailored reports when a specific type of document is captured by Librex or following a specific periodicity. Or you could activate notifications or the automatic transmission of certain documents when they meet a specific criteria. And those are just a few limited examples.

So we're challenging you... which specific document processes would you like to manage with Librex?
